Write slowly and carefully, referring back often to the stroke direction and stroke order of the models. As you write the character, say its pronunciation out loud and think of the meaning. You may find it helpful to write the Pinyin and basic English meaning of the character to the left of the large character on the Character Practice Sheet. In this manner, work your way through the six new characters of the lesson. Turn in the Character Practice Sheet in class the next day. One good way to memorize characters is to take a folded sheet of paper, cover up the characters and Pinyin and, looking only at the English, test yourself to see if you can write the characters and say the Chinese from memory. If you get a character or word wrong, write it and say it 5 times and test yourself again. With a pencil, put a small "x" by those words you keep getting wrong and single them out for special attention. In this manner, work your way through all the new characters and words. There will be a brief dictation quiz on the new characters and words at the beginning of the next written Chinese class period. What you must know to be able to read the Reading Exercises and go on to the next lesson is the characters and words indented under the section for each new character in the "New Characters and Words" and "New Words Written with Characters You Already Know" sections that are followed by word class abbreviations in bolded brackets. This is also what you will be expected to know for quizzes and tests. Everything else is for reference only. The Reading and Writing Exercises begin on p.
