The authors do not provide any basics, like an introduction to research design or research ethics, which might be a problem, especially for beginners. The methods are structured alphabetically. Additionally they are assigned to different phases in the research process, which is explained very briefly in the introduction. The phase to which one method is assigned is indicate Quantity or Quality? The phase to which one method is assigned is indicated through a number between 1 and 5 one method can be assigned to several phases. The introduction text and the explanation of the process is so brief and riddled with specialist terms, that someone new in this field might feel overwhelmed and confused. The book presents exactly methods. The extent of each chapter therefore does not follow the content or reflect the complexity of a method And I would definitely argue that Focus Groups require more explanation than one page of text. This leads to the next, main problem of this book: Each method is described so briefly, that the book cannot be considered anything else than an annotated list of methods and references. It needs to be mentioned, though, that the references given, are all very relevant and worth reading. Each method is illustrated by a brief case study. Furthermore the authors present several keywords to classify a method. These keywords are e. Generally this kind of classification would be very useful and handy. Although, these keywords are not explained anywhere in the book. The strength of the book is the mere quantity of methods and therefore it can serve as a good collection of reading tips. Although, the above described weaknesses outweigh this strength in my opinion. I was disappointed and a little irritated by this book, because I think it creates maybe unintentionally the impression that design research is just something fun and unscientific that everybody can learn in 5 minutes.
