Artemis had offered to re-release the record with more promotion. She also co-directed a video with Dweezil for "Underdog" co-starring Hello Kitty playing guitar. Loeb was a judge for the 1st and 8th annual Independent Music Awards to support independent artists. It included an interview by Andy Denemark, highlighting the creative process behind each song. Other band members include: During the performances she ended with a rendition of her new song "3, 2, 1, Let Go. The song was put in rotation on SiriusXM among other stations. Other collaborators on the score included Michelle Lewis and Dan Petty. Co-written and co-composed with Chris Unck , the song was also used in the April film Helicopter Mom. Loeb also starred in the film as a high school English teacher.

Music video[edit] The music video, directed by Ethan Hawke and released in , begins with a cat on a chair, then zooms out to Loeb wearing a forest green dress and tortoiseshell glasses [22] singing the lyrics while walking around in the empty New York City apartment in which she lived at the time. No audio, visual or green screen effects were used through very basic and simple video. It has two continuous camera shots of Loeb in an apartment. Very near the end of the music video, the cat reappears this time sitting on a windowsill.
