When his children were younger, they visited the library every Wednesday, and took their books home in a laundry basket. He made up his book *No Clean Clothes* during recess at a B. The kids were being kept inside because there were three grizzly bears on the playground. He has a dragon statue in his home to symbolize his battles with addiction. Munsch likes to take long walks with his dog in the afternoon. The publication of his book *Too Much Stuff!* He receives about 10, letters a year from fans. He believes parents should read to their kids for at least 20 minutes a day. It was his favourite book because his neighbour had an Angus dog and he thought the book was about that dog.
