Other animals, called carnivore, eat herbivores such as a sharp-shinned hawk. Omnivores, such as raccoons and bears eat both plants and animals. Decomposers break down plants to form soil. Within each group there are many species such as white oak, red oak, and much, much more oak. Sap flows back up to branches in the spring. Temperate soil The leaves that fall turn into soil. Forest Animals A deer mouse stays active during the winter months. It stores seeds and grains to eat. Tracks in the snow reveal that many animals are able to remain active all winter. Some animals that do that include deer mice, shrews, rabbits, gray squirrels, gray foxes, blue jays, and white tailed deer. Shrews have to eat half their weight in grubs, worms, and insects each day in the winter to survive. Squirrels stay warm in leaf nests.
