An oasis was and still is a welcome sight to desert travelers. It means shade from the unrelenting desert sun, and more importantly, water. The desert travelers were not certain that the oasis was real until they could touch the rough bark of the date palm trees, feel the shade of their branches, and cup up water with their hands onto their dust covered faces, lips, and tongues. One of the greatest fears when traveling in the desert would be that the oasis in the distance would turn out to be a mirage. The tired, longing eyes, straining to see in the windblown sands and refracted desert light, longed to see an oasis. When that oasis turned out to be only a mirage, the disappointment could be devastating. Not many of us travel through or live in physical deserts. But some of us not only travel through spiritual and emotional deserts, we live there. We know what it is like to be dry, weary, thirsty, and seeking the oasis, the ever elusive oasis, that time after time turns out to be a mirage. I have felt like those desert travelers and asked Perhaps you are asking this question now. Those all seem like such good things, such necessary things. There is only one oasis, one water source to quench the spiritual desert, to provide shade and refreshment. I like this quote that says, "He watches over you-- he is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day. You may have another question. God is so far away, how can he really see and care about what is going on down here? Who has not asked for a living, real God that experiences the same stuff down here that we do? Consider Jesus who was not the far-off looking oasis but a "one of us" down here type real oasis. God, in the form of Jesus, came down to earth and people could tell that he was the real deal. God says in Isaiah I will open rivers in high places, and fountains in the midst of valleys: I will make the wilderness a pool of water, and the dry land springs of water. How can there be an oasis be in the desert? And how can date palms survive in the middle of nowhere with no apparent source of water? For each date palm tree requires inches of rainfall each year. Yet the desert averages a lot less water. Water is supplied to an oasis through underground streams of water. Hidden, silent water, can travel for hundreds of miles, emerging to create an oasis in the desert. But there will be oases fed by invisible streams of water. As God says in Isaiah, "In a sun-scorched land you will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail. Hannah Whitall Smith wrote, "I do not mean that there will be no more outward trouble, or care, or suffering; but these very places will become green pastures and still waters inwardly to the soul. And that source is God Himself! Get connected and stay connected to the source, the supply of the never ending water. E-mail at any time.
