W stands for wishes or wants. I want my brother to visit me: Quiero que mi hermano me visite. E stands for emotions. Another pretty straightforward one. Impersonal expressions are simple: It is unfortunate that the restaurant is closed: R stands for recommendations or requests. My mother asks me to clean my room: Mi madre me dice que limpie mi cuarto. D stands for doubt; if there is uncertainty, the verb must be in the indicative. I doubt that it is going to rain: Dudo que vaya a llover. I hope that the storm passes without harm: There are only six true irregulars in the present subjunctive; be familiar with them for the AP exam. That may seem like a lot, but if you say the verbs in your head, you can hear how they should sound and adjust accordingly! Here are some examples: Some helpful hints for the AP Spanish exam: Creer que, pensar que, and saber que do NOT use the subjunctive; they express certainty. Note that the former use is a recommendation, while the latter indicates certainty. The subjunctive is definitely challenging, but you have all the tools you need to use it. Plus, the more you can throw in correctly on the AP exam, the better the graders will score your proficiency! Object Pronouns Object pronouns are another little tactic you can use to amp up your proficiency score. So what are they? Object pronouns indicate who and what receives an action. You can use them to avoid repetition across sentences. There are two types: Juan bought a book. What did he buy? Since the book is the thing being bought, it is the direct object. Direct object pronouns are ways to replace this direct object in a sentence. Ahora Julia tiene el libro. Instead, we can say: Ahora Julia lo tiene. The direct object pronouns are: They agree in number and gender with the direct object. Where do we place DOPs? There are a couple of rules: Place the DOP before a conjugated verb. Start at the last vowel and count two vowels backward. The professor teaches Spanish to the students. The students are taught, so they are the indirect object. Can you tell what the direct object is? Spanish is the direct thing being taught. The indirect object pronouns are the following:

Language is a creative, living, messy thing, and it should be fun. Why kill the joy with repetitive drills and grammar practice, right? First the good! Absolutely, completely, no-holds-barred free. Dialogue Each lesson is based around a dialogue. The dialogue is broken into manageable chunks so that the learner can listen and repeat. Pattern Presentations While the text digs a bit deeper into grammatical structures, the audio uses a very inductive approach. Each unit focuses on one or more grammar points – subjunctive, clitic pronouns, irregular verbs – and presents it using a wide variety of example sentences. The examples help the learner understand how the concept is used in everyday speech. Each example sentence is followed by a pause, so that the learner can repeat. I know, I know, drills are very last century. And improved automaticity leads to more fun with the language. There are several different kinds of drills in the FSI courses: Unfortunately, units are missing some audio for some of the later drills. I walk, and I listen, and I respond out loud. I know it sounds silly, but this part is really important for me. It keeps me alert and engaged. While it was originally aimed at beginners, it was only a small self-directed part of a full-time teacher-led course. You, too, can rock out to FSI.
