Use this guide to plan a meaningful, educational trip to the Alamo for your students. Make a Reservation Please register your group at least two weeks prior to your scheduled trip. Please note that the busiest season for school visits is March – May. Visiting during other months of the year may make your experience a better one. To reach the Alamo from U. From Interstate 37 northbound, exit at Commerce Street, turn left on Commerce and proceed ten blocks to Alamo Plaza, turn right and continue on one and one half blocks. Parking is available at several pay lots in the vicinity of the Alamo. Parking Buses may unload their passengers at the Houston Street gate or the Crockett Street gate, however, buses are not allowed to park in these areas. Parking Lot A at the Alamodome is free to buses when there is not a scheduled event. Please call Dome Security at to make a reservation. This includes entrance to the Alamo Church and the Long Barracks exhibition, along with the other activities listed below. These talks are approximately minutes long and are followed by a minute question and answer period. Cavalry Courtyard can hold a maximum of students sitting on the benches and on the ground. History Talks are offered on a first come, first serve basis. The film runs throughout the day in two locations – The Long Barrack Museum and the Arbor – and lasts approximately 20 minutes. Guided Tour Options For a deeper educational experience, the Alamo recommends guided tours for students. The tours below are offered at a discounted rate to school groups. Please contact our School Group Coordinator at ext. An Alamo History Interpreter will personally guide your class while explaining the history of the mission and the fortress, creating a memorable educational experience for students. The audio tour is available for rental seven days a week from 9 a. Your exclusive evening will include a private, personalized tour of the Alamo church and the Long Barrack Museum. Please note that lunch space is very limited and no tables are provided. Rules of Behavior for Group Visitors Please review the following rules with your students before your visit. All students must stay with their chaperones at all times. Be respectful of other visitors. Please use quiet voices when inside buildings. Remember, the Church is a memorial to the men who died here on March 6, Help us defend the Alamo! These buildings are more than years old. Please do not touch, lean or write on the walls or display cases. Please finish all food and beverages other than bottled water before entering any buildings. Be sure to get a picture in front of the famous Alamo Church, but please put your phones and cameras away before heading inside, as no photography is allowed inside the buildings. There are lots of exciting things to see and hear at the Alamo. Please stay safe and use the sidewalks to move around the grounds. Please visit the gift shop, but make sure students are accompanied by an adult. Help them ensure they have enough money before checking out and make sure they keep their purchases inside their bags until they have left the Alamo.
