

## Chapter 1 : How to Become A Wound Care Nurse, Wound Care Nurse Certification

*1. Wounds of creativity. School stifles creativity. This is perhaps the most obvious wound of school. Students' own passions and interests are generally ignored.*

What is an open wound? An open wound is an injury involving an external or internal break in body tissue, usually involving the skin. Nearly everyone will experience an open wound at some point in their life. Most open wounds are minor and can be treated at home. Falls, accidents with sharp objects, and car accidents are the most common causes of open wounds. In the case of a serious accident, you should seek immediate medical care. There are four types of open wounds, which are classified depending on their cause.

**Abrasion** An abrasion occurs when your skin rubs or scrapes against a rough or hard surface. Road rash is an example of an abrasion.

**Laceration** A laceration is a deep cut or tearing of your skin. Accidents with knives, tools, and machinery are frequent causes of lacerations. In the case of deep lacerations, bleeding can be rapid and extensive.

**Puncture** A puncture is a small hole caused by a long, pointy object, such as a nail or needle. Sometimes, a bullet can cause a puncture wound. Punctures may not bleed much, but these wounds can be deep enough to damage internal organs. If you have even a small puncture wound, visit your doctor to get a tetanus shot and prevent infection.

**Avulsion** An avulsion is a partial or complete tearing away of skin and the tissue beneath. Avulsions usually occur during violent accidents, such as body-crushing accidents, explosions, and gunshots. They bleed heavily and rapidly. Some wounds may be treated at home and others may require a trip to your doctor for a medical approach.

**Home care for minor wounds** Minor wounds can be treated at home. First, wash and disinfect the wound to remove all dirt and debris. Use direct pressure and elevation to control bleeding and swelling. When wrapping the wound, always use a sterile dressing or bandage. Very minor wounds may heal without a bandage. You should also make sure you get plenty of rest. Pain typically accompanies a wound. You can take acetaminophen Tylenol as directed on the package. Avoid products with aspirin since they can cause or prolong bleeding. Apply ice if you have bruising or swelling, and avoid picking at scabs.

**When to see a doctor** Although you can treat some wounds at home, you should see a doctor if: After cleaning and possibly numbing the area, your doctor may close the wound using skin glue, sutures, or stitches. You may receive a tetanus shot if you have a puncture wound. Depending on the location of your wound and the potential for infection, your doctor may not close the wound and let it heal naturally. This is known as healing by secondary intention, meaning from the base of the wound to the superficial epidermis. This process may require you to pack your wound with gauze. Although the healing may not look pretty, it prevents infection and the formation of abscesses. Another treatment for an open wound includes pain medication. In some cases, you may need surgery. If a body part is severed, it should be brought to the hospital for possible reattachment. Wrap the body part in moist gauze and pack it in ice. Disinfect and dry the wound thoroughly before dressing it again. Dispose of old dressings and bandages in plastic bags.

**Are there any complications from having an open wound?** The main complication of an open wound is the risk for infection. You may have an infection if the wound shows: In serious cases, you may need surgery to remove infected tissue and sometimes the surrounding tissue as well. Conditions that can develop from an open wound include: This condition is caused by an infection from the bacteria that cause tetanus. It can cause muscle contractions in your jaw and neck. This is a severe soft tissue infection caused by a variety of bacteria including Clostridium and Streptococcus that can lead to tissue loss and sepsis. This ensures you receive the most appropriate treatment and reduces your risk for complications and infection.

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*Wound Care Nurse What Does a Wound Care Nurse Do? Wound care nurses, sometimes referred to as wound, ostomy, and continence (WOC) nurses, specialize in wound management, the monitoring and treatment of wounds due to injury, disease or medical treatments.*

The result is often denial of our inner calling, our compass that points toward our true talents. For more pertaining to the effects of schooling on creativity see: Compliance The industrial-revolution foundation of the education system expects conformity and rewards predictable behavior, both intellectually and emotionally. We learn to comply in order to get along, to get good grades, and to be passed along to the next grade of our education. While any one teacher or administrator may encourage individuality, the presence of these pressures to be, act, and feel like all the others are unmistakable and unavoidable. The unintended consequence of this environment is that most learn to look to external rewards for motivation, directing their lives by what others do or hold valuable. Is it any wonder so many go through adulthood muddling through unfulfilling careers and relationships, and then have mid-life crises, waiting until the emotional toll becomes unbearable to finally reflect on who they really are and what they want to do with their lives? Excessive compliance is the enemy of high-level thinking. For more on how schools were initially designed to promote compliance rather than creativity or critical thinking, see A Brief History of Education. Rates of teenage depression and suicide are at alarming levels, with bullying often cited as a significant contributing factor. Bullying regularly arises when people are forced into settings where they have no power. It occurs regularly, for example, in prisons. As with prisons, the bullying trickles down through the hierarchy, and the more autocratic the school administration, the more severe the bullying as at elite British boarding schools, for example. By contrast, in non-coercive learning environments, children are no longer powerless or helpless, and bullying disappears. For more on bullying, see School Bullying: Rebelliousness The learners who make it their mission to not do what the students around them are doing are expressing a need for individual consideration and attention. Casting such students as angry outcasts or delinquents is only ignoring the root cause of the rebellion: Something in the system is not meeting their needs, and this is their way of expressing their dissatisfaction. Academically monolithic systems will often create students who are bored, alienated and unsatisfied. Children who are lectured to, learn how to lecture; if they are admonished, they learn how to admonish; if scolded, they learn how to scold; if ridiculed, they learn how to ridicule; if humiliated, they learn how to humiliate; if their psyche is killed, they learn how to kill. Less talented, less intelligent, less gifted, less capable, and ultimately "less valuable. Such prejudice and classification occurs routinely in the very place where parents are sending their children to be nurtured and to develop their learning prowess. Students who are assessed as mediocre or as failures may adopt this as their self-concept and behave accordingly" despite the fact that, biologically, human intellectual capabilities can change dramatically over the years. Perfectionism, and Over-Concern for Superficial Achievements Increasingly, academic outcomes are focused entirely on high achievement, as judged by grades and acceptance at prestigious colleges and universities. Failure is not an option; each goal is higher than the last, and the pressure to lead is oppressive for younger and younger students. This is another example of external measures determining choices and defining success for individuals who each should be determining what is important for them each day, not what they need to do to keep up or move ahead of their peers. In such an

environment, failure leads to shame, self-loathing, depression and persistent disappointment rather than serving as feedback for future success. That is no surprise. Children from economically better-off families are able to learn at home much of the basics taught in school. Children without the same home advantages must try to learn what the others already know, and the stress of failure makes such learning almost impossible. Some develop a fatalistic belief in their own stupidity; others drop out, whether physically or just mentally, from the whole enterprise. And thus, with each grade in school, the gap between rich and poor becomes greater. Often without any type of due process or independent review, children are handed harsh punishments, including suspensions, for non-violent offenses such as dress code violations, cell phone use, and truancy. The National Education Policy Center has reported that these policies impact low-income and minority students at far higher rates, leading these children to be labeled as offenders at increasingly younger ages, and often resulting in permanent suspensions and drop-outs in later years. Zero-tolerance policies are known to contribute to the school-to-prison pipeline, where children move from coercive schooling environments into the criminal justice system in a process that perpetuates inequality and disadvantage. A typical student spends more than 15, hours in school over the course of 13 years. Think of how much personally fulfilling learning and growth could have taken place during all that time instead!

High-performing middle schools “ usually with a white, middle- or upper-class majority ” would have to reserve up to 25 percent of their seats for students who score at the lowest 2 of 4 levels on state math and English tests. That means some students with high test scores would be shut out of their preferred schools and possibly steered to lower-performing schools which enroll more blacks and Hispanics. The proposal would affect current 4th graders who will enter the 5th grade in September, and apply to middle school in December. The DOE hopes to approve the plan by June. Schools Chancellor Richard Carranza, who joined the city school system this month , fanned the flames Friday by retweeting a news story on the meeting headlined: Wealthy white Manhattan parents angrily rant against plan to bring more black kids to their schools. At the struggling PS Sojourner Truth in Harlem, just 8 percent of students got a 3 or 4 “ passing or higher ” on the state English test last year, and only 1 percent hit those scores on the math test. The school is 90 percent black and Hispanic. But opposing parents at high-performing schools say the plan turns the merit system on its head. The system is motivating kids the wrong way. Unless they do that, the kids who have 3s and 4s are going to suffer. Enrollment in Harlem schools has dropped because of competition from charters and other district schools, said Dennis Morgan, a member of the District 3 Community Education Council. Admission to elementary schools is normally determined by residential zones. But after grade 5, students can apply to middle schools in their district. Students rank their preferences, and can list up to 12 choices. Some schools also rank the students they want. Then, students are matched to schools by computer algorithms that typically give most students their first or second choice, experts said. In another citywide change under the proposal, schools will not see how students rank them. So schools could no longer favor kids who rank them No. Currently, some popular schools cherry-pick the highest-scoring kids. Washington in Morningside Heights enrolls 80 percent of students who score a 3 or 4 on the English test and 85 percent who score a 3 or 4 in math. The school is 62 percent white, Under the District 3 plan, 17 middle schools would offer up to 10 percent of seats to students who score an average 1 on their fourth-grade exams and up to 15 percent to those who score an average 2. Some parents admit that privilege must not determine opportunity.
